The Observance of Lent begins February 22nd

This month we will move from the season of Epiphany, the time of signs and wonders with its green and white paraments and vestments, to the season of Lent, a season of repentance and discernment of our faithfulness to following Jesus. Our paraments change to purple to remind us of this movement to this discernment and repentance – this time when we are called to take note of what is counter to God's call and to turn around and make Christ center of our lives again. It's a time of reorientation.

February 22nd is Ash Wednesday. We will observe this day with opportunities for worship and reflection and the imposition of ashes.

At **7am** a brief Service of the Word with Imposition of Ashes will be held. Pastor Gordy will remain in the sanctuary for individual prayer and the imposition of ashes up until 8am.

At **7pm** we will have a Service of Holy Communion with the Imposition of Ashes.

Lenten Midweek Meal and Evening Prayer

On Wednesdays in Lent beginning February 29th we will gather for a simple soup supper at 6:00pm. At 7:00pm we will gather in the sanctuary for Lenten Evening Prayer. Choir will meet afterwards.

Stewardship News

Stewardship – Live Well From The Waters Of Your Baptism

Martin Luther said, "This life, therefore, is not godliness but the process of becoming godly, not health but getting well, not being but becoming, not rest but exercise. We are not now what we shall be, but we are on the way." We can't be "whole" in this life, but we can become acquainted with the wholeness to come by striving to live well in key aspects of our lives. The Wholeness Wheel depicts the interconnectedness of the individual aspects of well-being – spiritual, social/interpersonal, financial, emotional, physical, vocational, and intellectual.

Stewardship of our self and of our relationships is part of our faithful response as God's creation. At the center of the wheel, we are a new creation through the waters of baptism. What does it mean to be a new creation? We have received the gift of grace through Christ, who came that we might have abundant life. Abundant life is living as a new creation, being grounded and

centered in Christ and loving our neighbor as ourselves. ***"So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" (II Corinthians 5:17)***

Spiritual well-being: Living a centered life focused on God affects each aspect of our well-being. Turn to God for strength as you seek to live well in Christ. Nurture your relationship with God through prayer, devotions, worship, nature, art, and music. Explore who you are and know whose you are.

Social/Interpersonal well-being: We were created to be social persons by God with instructions to help and love each other. We are all part of a community and, individually, we are part of the body of Christ. Our ability to live well as individuals impacts our family, friends, congregations and community and, vice versa, being in relationship with others helps us to live well.

Emotional well-being: Being emotionally well means feeling the full range of human emotions and expressing them appropriately. Self-awareness is the first step. Recognizing and honoring your own feelings and those of others – stress, contentment, anger, love, sadness, joy, resentment – will help you live life abundantly.

Physical well-being: We are marvelously created by God. Being a good steward of our physical well-being is about caring for our body through exercise, diet, rest and renewal, and regular health screenings.

Vocational well-being: We all have a calling – vocation – to follow Christ's example, living a life of meaning, purpose and service to our neighbor. Our vocations are our life's work and passions – our everyday roles through which God calls us to help make this world a better place. Those who are well vocationally are faithful stewards of their talents and abilities, and find opportunities to build and use them.

Intellectual well-being: As we seek intellectual well-being, it is important for us to stimulate as well as rest our minds. Our minds have amazing capabilities, but too often we limit ourselves by our inability to understand—and believe in—our full potential. When we challenge ourselves to use neglected portions of our brain, we may discover untapped potential and grow in our confidence to try new things.

Financial well-being: In all aspects of well-being we are called to be stewards. Good financial stewards make decisions based on their values, which is evident in the way they save, spend and share. This understanding of stewardship embraces resilience, sustainability and generosity.

Let us pray, We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give us new birth, cleanse us from sin, and raise us to eternal life. Stir up in your people the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever. Amen. – *Evangelical Lutheran Worship*
